Staff Learning

On Monday during our student free day, all our education staff participated in a TeamTeach course which was a refresher for some staff and new training for others. The course was facilitated by Leith Tarling (CEWA Consultant) and focused on specialised behaviour support training. The training emphasised team building, personal safety, communication, and verbal and non-verbal de-escalation techniques for dealing with behaviours of concern and safe manual handling practices, all with the goal of reducing the need for physical intervention of students.

We are excited to get a trial of our new GROWTH program off the ground later this term but are still seeking one or two more presenters - please see the following page for more information.



NAPLAN

NAPLAN is a national literacy and numeracy assessment undertaken by students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9. It is the only national assessment that all Australian children undertake. Literacy and numeracy skills are the critical foundation for all learning and for the ability to participate effectively in society. NAPLAN questions assess content linked to the Australian Curriculum in English and Mathematics. NAPLAN individual student report and information for parents and carers will be handed to each child at the start of next week. If you have a student in Year 3 or 5, please read the information careful as there have been some changes in 2023.


WATER SUPPLY AND CONSERVATION INCURSIONS




