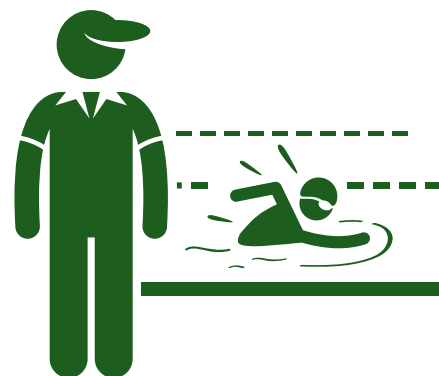


# ASSISTANT PRINCIPALS' NEWS

## Swimming Lessons

Next week (Monday 27 November to Thursday 30 November) our Pre-primary to Year 6 students will be attending Bayswater Waves for swimming lessons. Here are some key reminders for the four days:

- Students can wear bathers under their uniform but they must not be visible
- Shoes must be worn to school but thongs can be worn to swimming
- Pre-primary and Year 1 children can go home in their bathers
- Students will get changed at school
- Sport uniform can be worn all week
- Ensure all uniforms, towels, goggles etc are clearly labelled



The session times are:

Year 4, Year 5 & Year 6 - 12:30pm

Year 2 & Year 3 - 1:15pm

Pre-primary & Year 1 - 2:00pm

Bus times:

Year 4, Year 5 & Year 6 depart at 12:10pm and arrive back at 1:30pm.

Year 2 & Year 3 depart at 12:45pm and arrive back at 2:15pm.

Pre-primary and Year 1 depart at 1:40pm and arrive back at 2:55pm.

As the bus will arrive at 2.55pm, the James Street round about will need to be kept clear until the bus arrives so it can enter and turn around to drop off the students safely. We will potentially need to close James Street until the bus has left. Once the bus has entered, families are welcome to drive into James Street for regular pick-up. We recommend parents arrive a few minutes later than normal if they wish to pick up on James Street (e.g. arrive at 3.05/3.10pm). Hamilton Street is encouraged for pickup during this week. We apologise for the disruptions to the pickup routines.

## Desks for Purchase

If you are looking at making a homework or study area at home, we will be selling our Year 2 desks for \$10 each. Please contact the office to make payment and collection will be during Week 10 (11 - 14 December).

## Lost Property

There is an abundance of lost property at the uniform shop. Could parents please check the lost property box located in the hallway near the uniform shop. Lost property not claimed by Week 9 will either be sold second-hand, donated to charity or disposed of.

## Playing On School Grounds After Hours

A reminder that students are not permitted to play on the school grounds after hours even when supervised by their parents. We do not provide playground supervision after school as teachers are involved in meetings or are getting learning activities prepared for the following day.

Please ensure that your child has a school hat with their name clearly labelled. With the weather warming up, this will help to protect your child from harmful UV rays. Additionally, applying sunscreen before school is another way to stay safe. All classrooms have a supply of sunscreen, which can be reapplied throughout the day by students. School hats are now available for purchase from the uniform shop.



## End of Year Reports

End of Year reports for students in Pre-primary to Year 6 will be available through Seqta Engage on Tuesday 5 December.

Year 6 families and families not returning in 2024, please ensure that you have downloaded or printed off any reports that you wish to keep a copy of. Your child will be removed from Seqta and you will no longer have access to these documents.

## Mobile Phones

A reminder that if you decide to send your child to school with a mobile phone, it needs to be stored at the office. This will keep the phone safe and protect the privacy of your child and other children. If you need to make contact with your child during school hours, contacting the office will always be the most effective and efficient way.

Please ensure ex-students and older siblings are seated with their families for the duration of the concert.



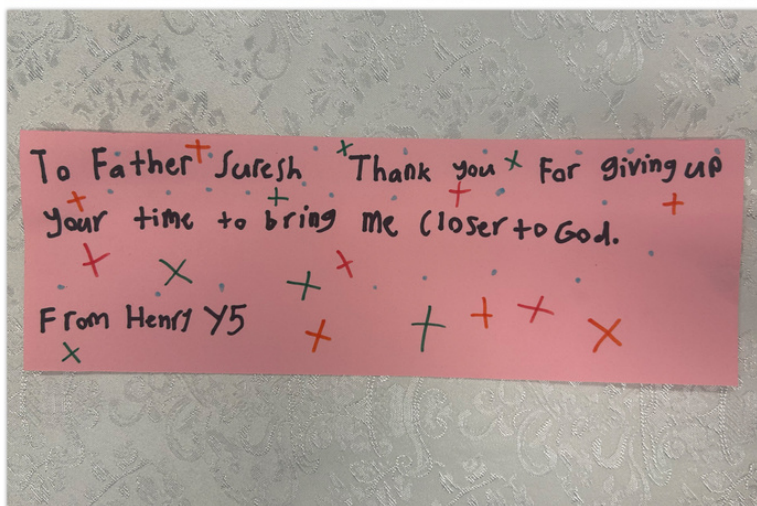
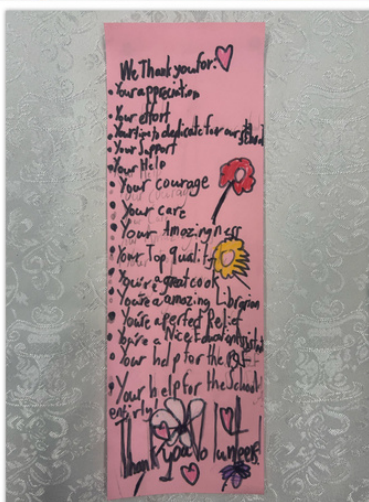
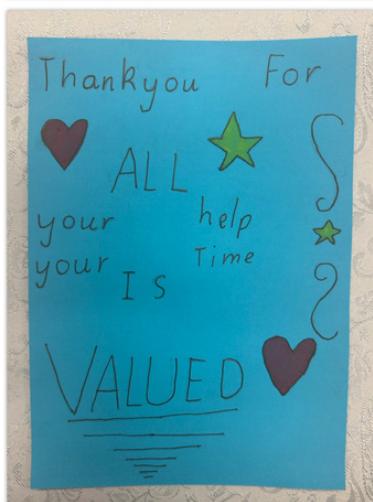

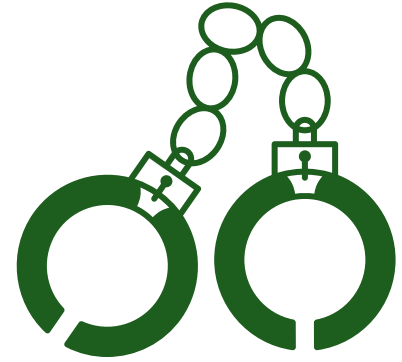




# YEAR 4 CONVICTS

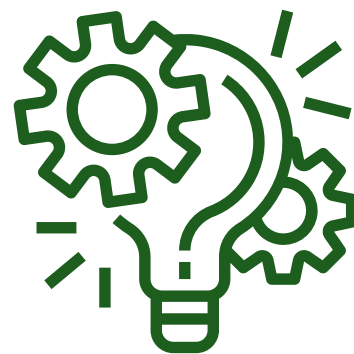


# YEAR 3 & 5 STEM PROJECTS

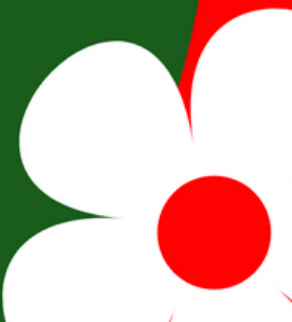

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## Great News!

Did you know that **Outside School Hours Care is eligible for the Child Care Subsidy (CCS)?**

On average our families receive a 76% rebate on Before School, After School and Holiday Programs.

Our Before, After School and Holiday programs are designed to support school communities and busy families. We provide an engaging and educational environment for children to form friendships, learn life skills and prepare them for life beyond the classroom.

Since July 10 2023, families who earn less than \$530,000pa are eligible for the Child Care Subsidy with up to 90% off fees! This means even more families can access quality programs such as our **'Rise then Shine'** before school program, **'Stay and Play'** after school program, and our Holiday HQ School Holiday programs at a very affordable rate. On average, our families get a 76% rebate on all sessions.

All of our 460+ services across Australia are registered and approved by the Australian Government to ensure parents at our services can access CCS.

### What if I don't currently get CCS and want to apply?

If your family earns under \$530,000 and meets the following requirements, you are eligible for the Child Care Subsidy (CCS).

You or your partner must meet all of the following:

- care for your child at least 2 nights per fortnight, or have 14% care
- are liable for fees for care provided at an approved child care service. Every centre we run across Australia is registered and approved by the Australian Government
- meet the residence rules.

Your child must also meet both of these:

- immunisation requirements
- not be attending secondary school unless an exemption applies.

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## How much can I get?

The Child Care Subsidy amount you're eligible for will be based on the following:

- your family's income
- the hourly rate cap based on the type of approved child care you use and your child's age
- the hours of activity you and your partner do
- the number of children in your care. The amount of subsidised childcare you can access per fortnight applies to each child.

You can use this Payment and Service Finder to estimate how much Child Care Subsidy (CCS) you may get.

## How do I make a claim?

You need to set aside about 30 minutes to do the following:

1. Create a MyGov account and link it to Centrelink. If you've claimed a payment before, you can use your Centrelink Customer Reference Number (CRN) to link Centrelink to myGov.
2. Provide your identity. You can do this by providing one document from each of the following lists:
  - Australian birth certificate, Australian citizenship certificate, Australian passport, Australian Visa
  - Australian driver license, Australian Certificate of Registration by Descent, ImmiCard
  - You may also need to enter some details from your Medicare card.
3. As you complete your claim, you may be asked for certain documents or information. These will show as required in your claim. Documents may include:
  - Tax File Number, child's birth certificate, financial records, employment details (payslip) Health Card, relationship status, residence details if you have lived outside of Australia.
4. Confirm your enrolment by asking your childcare service for your enrolment details then confirm them by using your Centrelink online account through myGov. Select Family from the menu, followed by Child Care then Enrolments.

## What happens next?

Once your claim has been processed you will receive an Assessment Notice either by regular mail or via your MyGov Inbox.

The Assessment Notice will inform you of the following:

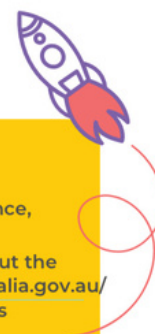
- if you're eligible
- the childcare fee assistance you'll receive
- the annual cap that applies to you
- the withholding amount.

If you are eligible, the payment will be automatically applied to the fees billed by your childcare service. You don't have to do anything else.

It is your responsibility to then keep your information up to date. You can do this by regularly checking your details are correct in MyGov and tell them if:

- your family's income changes
- your or your partner's activity levels change
- your relationship status changes
- there are any other changes to your or your partner's circumstances.

Your information about your family circumstances needs to be accurate so you receive the correct amount of CCS.
